The monthly Ballroom dances, including the Installation Ball, Luau, Christmas Party and New Year's Eve Party were well-attended and enjoyed by members and guests. We plan to continue the celebration with a Spring picnic on the patio for all to enjoy. 
Membership





#2188 Supports Bingo at Martinsburg, WV Veterans Hospital in 2017

On the 5th Friday of a month, our Lodge, with support from the Annandale Knights of Columbus, hosts Bingo at the Veterans Affairs Hospital in Martinsburg, WV. During these visits in 2017, the hospitalized veterans are treated to a fun evening. The Bingo program begins with a “free” store, where the veterans can browse and choose from any number of items from multiple tables filled with polo/t-shirts, puzzles, back scratchers, cards, books, hand-made scarves/hats, etc. Then when Bingo begins, canteen coupon books are given as prizes. Finally, as we say goodbye to each attendee, we give them 1-2 coupon books as an additional “Thank You” for their service. The veterans can use the coupon books in the VA Hospital canteen/store to buy any number of items, including food, clothing, electronics, etc. For the 4 events that were hosted in 2017, our members donated 84 hours of time, drove almost 2,000 miles, donated \$350 in mileage/gas, and over \$1,000 worth of merchandise/items for the “free” store. The coupon books provided by the Lodge totaled \$750. This is one of our Lodge’s successful major programs that supports our veterans.

USO Reagan National Airport Food Deliveries for 2017



Thanks to the generous donations of Arlington-Fairfax Elks #2188 members, the frozen food deliveries to the Reagan National Airport USO continued to be made every two weeks in calendar year 2017. The total numbers of the time, cost and mileage needed to support this program are in and they are impressive! The members of #2188 donated almost 200 hours of their time and drove over a total of 2,100 miles for the 26 deliveries made this year. Through member donations and other funding, approximately \$3,000 worth of food was delivered to the USO this past year. These frozen food deliveries help ensure our traveling military and their families have a hearty meal during their travels.
