Fourth Annual Children's Fair at #2188



The **4th Annual Children's Fair** is scheduled for Sunday, July 10, 2016, from 11:30AP to 4:00P, I ask that members rally around this endeavor and help make it as successful as previous year's events! The Children's Fair is the way our Lodge utilizes a \$2,000 Beacon Grant from the Elks National Foundation. The Grant must be utilized for an on-going, Elks-led community project. As stated, this will be our 4th annual event. I have invited several organizations to send families to us for this fun-filled event. Each child attending will receive a \$20 prepaid Payless Shoe Source gift card, as well as a backpack and tote bag. The theme for the day will center on crafts that encourage the children to create! We will have 65-70 children and their families in attendance. The day will start with a puppet show at 11:30A, followed by a "picnic-style" lunch. As with the previous years, the Elks Auxiliary will be serving tasty desserts! The Fairfax County Fire Department Station #30 members will be on-hand with trucks and an ambulance for the children to explore. The Fairfax Sheriff's Department will provide child fingerprinting and ID cards. The theme for the day will be "Creativity"

MEMBERSHIP PRIMER (from Lodge Secretary Jan Sullivan)

I have received many comments from prospective members and candidates concerning the process of becoming a member of our Lodge. I thought it might be helpful to remind everyone of the steps we each have taken to become a member. If you have any questions, please contact the Secretary.

1. An application blank must be completely filled out and given to the Lodge Secretary, with the application fee of \$40. If the candidate is under the age of 26, their application fee is only \$20.
2. The Application blank has confused some of our members. The member *proposing* (i.e., sponsoring) the new candidate must fill in the top portion of the blank, where it says "Proposer." The candidate fills in the remainder starting with "Proposes."
3. The Secretary will send the candidate a letter enclosing a receipt showing they have paid the application fees, and entitling them admission to the Lodge during their candidacy.
4. The application will be read at the next meeting after it is received. The second meeting after receipt, the candidate will be voted on.
5. After the ballots have been cast, and the candidates elected, the Secretary will send a letter setting forth the date for their Orientation and Initiation, and telling them the amount of their pro rata dues for the remainder of the year. Until they get that letter, or an email, they are not to show up for Initiation. We may have one while they are in process, but it does not mean all new candidates are ready for Initiation.
6. All members are encouraged to attend the Initiation

The motto adopted by the Board this year is “**Charity begins at home!**” Let me bring you up-to-date on several projects the Board is working on to improve the Lodge.

If you have been to Lodge recently, you will notice that this year we have a brand new tent covering the Pavilion, since our previous tent was long overdue for replacement. This tent was not a budgeted item, but was made possible by generous donations of our members, affiliated groups and future planned fundraising. If you would like to contribute to this cause, see our project lead (Jerry Sall) or Tom Lotfabadi. Steve Thiebaut has the project lead on adding an additional roof cover and repairs to the BBQ cooking area next to the pavilion. This project is made possible by the generous donation of time and materials of member Dickey Tye. If you see Dickey in the Lodge, please say “Thank-you!” Sharon Dunfrund has the project lead on gathering information on upgrading the front doors of the Lodge to make them handicap-accessible. This is something that several of our members have asked for. Jim Weed has the project lead on identifying companies that can offer us a good deal on cleaning our carpets and buffering/waxing our tile floors on a quarterly basis. Sammy Roth has the project lead on developing the tools necessary to track and manage our Lodge maintenance on a weekly, monthly, quarterly and annual basis. This also includes a tool that will allow us to track and manage all of the upgrades that we want to complete. I have the project lead on investigating upgrades to our existing security system.

The Lodge's Veterans Committee plans and coordinates a variety of activities for veterans and service members. ELKS YOUTH CAMP (Lodge Director Barbara Marshall)



It's hard to believe that we are getting ready for another camping season at the Virginia Elks Youth Camp. For our newer members, this is our major state project and each year we send deserving youth from our community to camp for a week. This year, **the girls go July 3 to July 9, and the boys go July 17 to July 23**. As our Lodge membership has dropped so has the quota of campers we are asked to send. While we sent close to 50 campers about 10 years ago, this year our quota is only 28. Believe it or not, I have already been approached by parents and counselors from the schools asking for spots, so I know those 28 slots are going to be used up quickly. I would like to see us send more than our quota. The camp has the space but doing so increases the cost to the Lodge. **If you would like to sponsor all or part of the tuition for a camper, the cost is \$150 per camper**. This would allow us to serve more children in the community. If you are interested, please contact me directly. At a later time I will be looking for chaperones to accompany the kids to and from camp. This is a nice way to see the camp, which is about a 4-hour drive and located near Clifton Forge in southwest Virginia. Our Lodge has always been one of the biggest supporters of the camp.
